DRESS CODE

Camper attire should be modest and in keeping with the character and attitude we should be expressing as young Christians. Campers will not be allowed to wear shirts that contain sexual innuendoes, that promote the use of cigarettes, drugs, or alcohol, that are anti-Christian, or that would be offensive to the general public. Campers should be modest in their choice of swimwear. Appropriate swimsuits for girls include tankinis or one-piece suits. Bikinis will not be allowed at camp.

CANCELLATION

We have received your deposit. If you cancel at least 14 days prior to your scheduled arrival for any reason, all but \$25 dollars will be returned. If you cancel less than 14 days prior to your scheduled arrival, we will refund all but \$25 only in cases of personal illness or family tragedy.

MEDICAL FORM & MEDICATION

Enclosed you will find a yellow Emergency / Medical Information Form. Fill this out and bring it to camp with you. This form contains health history information and an authorization for medical care which are critical in the event of an emergency. The First-Aid Coordinator will telephone parents if their child is injured or sick enough to seek outside medical treatment or if a sickness results in the camper sitting out for four consecutive hours of normal activities.

Prescription medication brought to camp must be turned over to the First-Aid Coordinator at registration. All prescription medication must be in its original container with the prescription label and dosage instructions. The camp stocks some common non-prescription medication. Parents may authorize its use by completing and signing the appropriate section on the back of the medical form.

INSURANCE

In the event that your child needs professional medical treatment, the parent/guardian's insurance will be considered the primary carrier. The camp carries medical and dental insurance on all campers which can be used in a secondary role, helping with deductibles and filling the gaps left unpaid by the parents' primary coverage.

SPENDING MONEY

The registration fee covers all meals, lodging, and all program activities except horseback riding. However, you may want to pack some extra money for a camp T-shirt (\$11-\$15), and snacks at the canteen (suggested \$12 for the week). Spending money is turned over to the camp at registration and purchases may be made on a debit system. The remaining balance will be returned to the camper on the final day. This method prevents lost or stolen money, which may spoil a child's stay at camp.

HORSEBACK RIDING

Campers wishing to ride horses during their stay will need to sign up at registration and pay an additional fee of \$20 for four rides during the week of camp.

PERMISSION TO PHOTOGRAPH

With this printed notice, it is assumed that Camp Lakeview reserves the right to photograph your child and use his/her photograph and/or captioned name in future printed promotional material. If you do not wish to grant the camp this right, please let us know prior to registration or verbally at the time of registration.

PHONE CALLS

We discourage campers from calling home. However, campers may call (collect) if requested to do so by the parents. Incoming calls may be made to **812-342-4815**. If you wish to speak with your child personally, meal times are usually convenient.

MAIL

Mail will be delivered to the campers each evening at supper. Please be sure to send it in time for it to arrive before your child leaves camp. Mail all correspondence to:

E-MAIL

Campers will be allowed to e-mail messages out during afternoon free time. Campers wishing to do so should bring all addresses with them. To leave a message for your child, visit the camp's website at www.camplakeview.com. On the home page, click the "Camper Mail" button and follow the instructions. Your message will be limited to about 500 characters and no attached files will be allowed.

RELEASE OF CAMPERS / CARPOOLING

The camp will assume that all campers will be going home with their own parent. If this is not the case (due to carpooling or other circumstances), the camp must be notified in writing of the person who will be picking up your child. This may be done by mail or at the registration desk on the day of arrival. This notification must include a parental signature.

LOST AND FOUND ITEMS

All lost and found items from the summer of 2012 will be stored at camp until January 1, 2013. We will make every effort to help the owners retrieve all lost and found items. Please help us help you by marking all items brought to camp, checking your items before leaving camp, and notifying us as soon as possible once you realize an item is missing. Camp Lakeview is not responsible for lost items that cannot be located.
